Welcome to Spotlight Productions, the resident youth theatre at Hinchingbrooke School, Huntingdon. Established 18 years ago, it is a non-profit making community based performing arts group, committed to producing outstanding musical theatre for young people in the Cambridgeshire area.

Run by a team of dedicated enthusiastic volunteers and teachers, our key aims are to encourage and nurture singing, dancing and acting talent amongst 11-28 year olds, performing much-loved musicals and demonstrating to our audiences that a West End theatre experience, can be had locally in Cambridgeshire. While the group is non-profit making and manned entirely by volunteers, leaders have extensive backgrounds in musical theatre. In addition, there are a large number of specialists who support the group with expertise in scenery design and construction, wardrobe, hair, make-up and child safeguarding. The group is very fortunate to have a sponsor, Urban & Civic, who provides us with storage facilities for our 30,000+ costumes, scenery and props. We continue to look for new supporters for the group, especially those who can assist with sewing, scenery construction, painting, hair and make-up. To date, over 1,700 young people have performed in our shows and our original ethos remains the same, to encourage young people from any background to take part. The group has been recognised for its support and development of young people, receiving both the Hinchingbrooke Foundation Community Award and the Huntingdon Mayor's Award for services in the community.

I have always been fascinated with the story of Oliver Twist and can remember watching the film of the musical many years ago when Ron Moody played Fagin.

When the Theatre Royal Drury Lane announced its revival starring Rowan Atkinson, I just had to buy a ticket and was 'blown away' by the show. OLVER 2022 IS DEDICATED TO FREDA & SIMON





It is with much sadness that since our last show back in 2019, two of our most loyal supporters are now no longer with us. Graham's mother Freda and Kevin's partner Simon both sadly passed away in 2021. We know that they will be looking down on our performances with pride, but show weeks will certainly never be quite the same again.



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Act I



The musical opens in the workhouse, as the half-starved orphan children are entering the enormous dining room for dinner. They are fed only gruel, but find some solace by imagining a richer menu, ("Food Glorious Food"). Oliver gathers up the courage to ask for more. He is immediately apprehended and is told to gather his belongings by Mr Bumble and the Widow Corney, the heartless and greedy caretakers of the workhouse ("Oliver!"). Mr Bumble and Widow Corney are left alone and Mr Bumble begins to make amorous advances. Widow Corney pretends to resent his attentions, but ends up on Mr Bumble's lap, as he eventually proposes to her ("I Shall Scream!"). Mr Bumble then takes Oliver and sells him as an apprentice to an undertaker, Mr Sowerberry ("Boy for Sale"). He and his wife taunt Oliver and Mr Bumble ("That's Your Funeral"), causing Mr Bumble to become angry and storm out. Oliver is sent to sleep in the basement with the coffins ("Where Is Love?").

The next morning Noah Claypole, another employee of Sowerberry, insults Oliver's dead mother, whereupon Oliver begins pummeling him. Mrs Sowerberry and her daughter, Charlotte, also Noah's girlfriend, run in and Mr Bumble is sent for. He and the Sowerberrys lock Oliver in a coffin, but during all the commotion Oliver escapes. After a week on the run, he ends up in the city of London and meets a boy about his age known as the Artful Dodger. Dodger seems a kindly boy and invites Oliver to join him and his friends ("Consider Yourself"). Dodger is, unknown to Oliver, a pickpocket and he invites Oliver to come and live in Fagin's lair. Fagin is an elderly criminal, now too old to thieve himself, who now teaches young boys to pick pockets. Oliver is completely unaware of any criminality and believes that the boys make handkerchiefs rather than steal them. Oliver is introduced to Fagin and his boys and is taught their ways ("You've Got to Pick a Pocket or Two").

The next day, Oliver meets Nancy, an older member of Fagin's gang and the lover of Fagin's terrifying associate Bill Sikes, a brutal house-burglar whose abuse she endures because she loves him. Nancy, along with her younger sister Bet and the boys, sing about how they don't mind a bit of danger ("It's a Fine Life"). Oliver bows deeply to Nancy and Bet, trying to be polite. All the boys laugh and mimic Oliver. Nancy singles out Dodger to demonstrate the way the rich people treat each other ("I'd Do Anything"). Nancy and Bet leave and Oliver is sent out with the other boys on his first pickpocketing job ("Be Back Soon"). Dodger, another boy named Charley Bates and Oliver decide to stick together and when Dodger and Charley rob Mr Brownlow, a wealthy old man, they run off, leaving the horrified Oliver to be arrested for the crime ("The Robbery").

Act II

In the Three Cripples pub, to help take her mind off of Sikes' neglect towards her, Nancy strikes up an old tavern song with the low-life ruffians, ("Oom-Pah-Pah"). Bill Sikes makes his first appearance and disperses the crowd ("My Name"). Dodger runs in and tells Fagin about Oliver's capture and removal to the Brownlow household. Scared he will betray the gang's whereabouts, Fagin and Bill decide to abduct Oliver and bring him back to the den, with Nancy's help. Nancy, who has come to care for Oliver, at first refuses to help, but Bill physically abuses her and forces her into obedience. In spite of this, Nancy still loves Bill and believes he loves her too ("As Long as He Needs Me").

The next morning, at Mr Brownlow's house in Bloomsbury, Mrs Bedwin the housekeeper sings to Oliver ("Where Is Love? [Reprise]") and Oliver wakes up. Mr Brownlow and Dr Grimwig decide that Oliver is well enough to go outside, so Brownlow sends Oliver to return some books to the library. Oliver sees a group of street vendors and joins them in song ("Who Will Buy?"). As the vendors leave, Nancy and Bill appear and grab Oliver. They bring him back to Fagin's den, where Nancy saves Oliver from a beating from Sikes after the boy tries to flee. Nancy remorsefully reviews their dreadful life, but Bill maintains that any living is better than none. Fagin tries to act as an intermediary ("It's A Fine Life [Reprise]"). Left alone, Fagin wonders what his life might be like if he left London and began an honest life ("Reviewing the Situation"), however, after thinking of various excuses, he elects to remain a thief.

Back at the workhouse, Mr Bumble and the Widow Corney, now unhappily married, meets the dying pauper Old Sally, brought to them by the workhouse matron, who tell them that Oliver's mother, Agnes, left a gold locket when she died in childbirth. Old Sally stole the locket, which she gives to the Widow Corney. Mr Bumble and Widow Corney, realizing that Oliver may have wealthy relatives, visit Mr Brownlow, who has advertised in newspapers for news of him, hoping to profit from any reward given for information ("Oliver! [Reprise]"). Mr Brownlow realises they are not interested in Oliver's welfare, but only money and throws them out, but recognizes the picture inside the locket as a picture of his daughter and realizes that Oliver is actually his grandson.

Nancy visits Mr Brownlow, explains how she and Bill abducted Oliver and remorsefully promises to deliver Oliver to him safely that night on London Bridge. She ponders again about Bill ("As Long as He Needs Me [Reprise]"). Suspecting that Nancy is up to something, Bill follows her as she sneaks Oliver out of Fagin's den. At London Bridge, he confronts them, knocks Oliver unconscious and clubs Nancy to death. He then grabs Oliver and runs off. Mr Brownlow arrives and discovers Nancy's body. A large crowd forms, among them the distraught Bet. Bullseye, Bill's dog, turns on his master and returns to the scene of the crime and the crowd prepares to follow him to the hideout. Fagin and his boys leave the den in panic. Not finding Bill, the crowd returns to the Thames Embankment. Bill appears at the top of the bridge, holding Oliver as hostage and threatening to kill him. Two policemen sneak up on him. One of them shoots Bill and the other grabs Oliver. After Oliver is reunited with Mr Brownlow, the mob disperses offstage in order to track down Fagin. He appears and decides that the time has never looked better for him to straighten out his life ("Reviewing the Situation [Reprise]").

CREATIVE TEAM

Graham & Sarah Wilkinson Artistic Director, Choreographer & Founders

Welcome to Spotlight Productions 19th Show. We have both been involved in theatre for the past 39 years and whilst Graham predominantly 'trod the boards' and directed, Sarah, as a qualified dance teacher, specialised in ballroom, modern and theatrical dance, teaching in a number of local schools. In September 2004, we formed our own not-for-profit performing arts group - Spotlight Productions. Since conception, we have staged 17 large-scale musicals to sell-out audiences. These include Grease (2005), A Whitechapel Tale (2006), Bugsy Malone (2006), Disco Inferno (2007), 42nd Street (2008), Back to the 80's (2009), Hairspray (2010), Fame (2011), Schools Will Rock You (2012), Some Like it Hot (2013), Les Misérables (2014), Singin' In The Rain (2015), Disco Inferno (2016), Legally Blonde (2017), Sister Act (2018) and Grease (2019). All have received fantastic feedback.

At the end of December 2021, we were delighted to finally welcome our audiences back after a 32 month break due to COVID-19, with our sell-out 'Magic of the Musicals' Christmas fundraiser show. This featured some of the best loved songs from the West End, performed by past and present cast members.

We continue to believe in our initial ethos that young people from any background should have the right to take part in our productions and hence Spotlight subscriptions remain at only £3 per week. The rest of our funding is raised through ticket sales and hiring of costumes, scenery and props. We are fortunate to have endless support and assistance from leaders, parents, cast members and more recently local companies. Without this, the Group would never be as successful as it is and we are truly grateful.

Will Swepstone Technical Director

I have now been working with Spotlight for 12 years. Initially behind the scenes, before taking on the official technician role in 2014. During my early years with Spotlight, I assisted with lighting for "Singin' in the Rain", controlled a LED light-up dance floor in "Disco Inferno" (Something I would not volunteer to do again in a hurry....) and setup & ran sound for "Legally Blonde" and "Sister Act". In 2019, I took on a full-time job as a Technician at Amina Technologies and I became the Technical Director for Spotlight.... which I have since learnt involves doing EVERYTHING! (...website, marketing, tickets, programme, etc) For both our Christmas Show & "Oliver!", I have been heavily involved in the Scenic design alongside Graham, utilising CAD to create our scenery. During COVID downtime, I spent a huge amount of time up at our storage facility building all the scenery pieces needed for both shows.

The Christmas Show was the first time I fully designed the lighting plot as well as running sound and I am excited to do the same for our major musical, "Oliver!".

Next year presents another huge challenge as I need to design & build a luxury cruise liner for "Anything Goes". This is possibly my biggest challenge and I hope it doesn't end up like the Titanic!

Simon Jeffery

Director

I have been teaching drama and performing arts to both young people and adults for the past 15 years. In 2010, I graduated with a BA Honours Degree in Drama and Theatre Studies and went on to further develop my teaching experience in Massachusetts, USA for a short time. I have now directed over 26 different productions, ranging from the classics to new originals and was delighted to join Spotlight Productions in 2013 to assist with Les Misérables. Since then I have become Graham's 'right-hand man' co-directing and stage managing the Spotlight shows. The cast has once again risen to the challenge and I can't praise them enough for the dedication and enthusiasm they have put into this year's show.

Charlotte Pergande Vocal Coach

I joined Spotlight in 2004 when my parents, alongside Sarah and Graham formed the group. I set up my own private music business in 2010, teaching piano, vocals and drama and I provide private tuition for those taking LAMDA exams. I was delighted to accept the position of Spotlight's Vocal Coach & Musical Director for this years production and am very proud of the accomplishments of our cast.

Cheryl O'Leary Choreographer

I have been a fully qualified Ballroom, Latin & Freestyle dance teacher for over 25 years, running my own dance school CK's Academy of Dance in the London and Huntingdon areas. I came to Spotlight as a mum whose son wanted to 'tread the boards' and here I found my Spotlight Family! After choreographing some of the numbers for our Christmas show "Magic of the Musicals", I am delighted to be able to assist with the production of "Oliver!" - a show with a fantastic cast and production team. I love working with the team and look forward to being a part of many future shows. I hope you enjoy the show!

Judith Ekblom Jarrold Stage Manager

I have just marked my 12th show with Spotlight. I originally joined the group to help with costumes, as my sister was a cast member. Although I now live in London, I still love being involved and come back each year to run backstage. Having finished my degree, I am now working as a bespoke tailor with Maurice Sedwell on Savile Row and in addition to performing the role of Stage Manager, this year, I have also taken an active role in costuming the show, creating Fagin's and Nancy's costumes. I have worked with the Group since its formation. My key responsibility is the production and sourcing of props. My activities have certainly been diverse over the years and have included making muskets for Les Misérables, sourcing bathroom 'accessories' for Disco Inferno, acquiring law books and pink 'fluffy stuff' for Legally Blonde, religious accoutrements and the biggest prop so far... Greased Lightnin' for Grease. This year I have been tasked with building the carts and barrows for the street sellers, as well as assisting with general scenery construction.

Angela Black Child Safeguarding Officer

I am an Ofsted-registered childminder and hold a Cambridgeshire County Council Chaperone Licence. I have been working with children for the past 30 years and the last 11 years with Spotlight. I really enjoy the performing arts and watching the young people fulfil their dreams and grow in confidence within our friendly group. Managing the group's 10 chaperones, I will be behind the scenes ensuring that our cast are safe and happy throughout the show's run.

Melissa Wilson Head of Wardrobe, Costumier and Chaperone

I joined the group alongside my two children in 2011 and currently create and maintain our extensive collection of costumes. On a Saturday morning you will find me at our storage unit, checking and preparing costumes for hires and ensuring that everything is in order.
